**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

- A. Press Box - Dave Thompson applied for permits to begin work on the Press Box. Mr. Hans had \$30,000 set aside in Capital Trust funds, but will now only use \$5,000.00 for material. Mr. Thompson and the Wildwood High School Class of 1976 will refurbish the entire project. Discussion was held on capital improvement accounts and past football teams.
  
- B. Maxwell Field - Ms. Kilian has not been able to get a response from Lowe's regarding the donation of mulch for the playground. She will now approach Action Supply and Smeltzer & Sons Feed & Pet Supplies. Mr. Hans will measure out the playground and get that information to Ms. Kilian so can relay that information when asking for a donation. A detailed discussion was held on what work is to be done regarding rubber mulch, installing a border and playground equipment. The

playground equipment is very unsafe and poses a safety hazard. The Board feels that if the equipment is unsafe, it should be removed before someone gets hurt. A memo will be sent to the Administrator from the Recreation Commission Board requesting that Public Works remove the playground equipment.

- C. Fox Park - Discussion was held on damage at the Fox Park playground. There is a huge hole under one of the swings that has been there for a couple of years, which is a safety hazard.

1. Basketball Camp - Bobby Mulholland will be running the camp with the help of the Wildwood basketball team. The camp runs from Friday, November 21<sup>st</sup> to Sunday November 23<sup>rd</sup>. The cost is \$60.00 per person. Normally the fees are split 75% to the person running the event and 25% to the Rec. However, Mr. Has suggested that we keep \$10.00 per fee paid and give the balance of \$50.00 to Mr. Mulholland so that he can pay his employees.

A motion was made by Mr. Martin and seconded by Ms. Phillips to keep \$10.00 per fee paid and give the balance of \$50.00 to Mr. Mulholland.

2. Birthday Parties - Two are scheduled between now and the end of November. The cost to host a party is \$150.00 for the building usage plus the cost of insurance. The events take place after hours, usually on Sunday.
3. One Call - The phone system is working well and will be used much more once the football league gets started.
4. Stucco - The work is finished and it looks great.
5. Vending - The machines are generating more revenue now than when it was leased from Big Time Vending. In 5 months, the vending has generated \$866.68, not including the \$500.00 worth of food supplies. The funds will be even greater once we get into the busy season.
6. Little League - The Wildwood Recreation Center took over the running of the league. A new board has been formed and they are making progress. Mr. Hans met with Don

Cabrera, who is the Commissioner of Public Works in Wildwood Crest and discussed with him getting the fields in shape. They need some work as they have been neglected.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** During regularly scheduled City of Wildwood Recreation Commission Meeting. Remarks will be limited to ten (10) minutes per person. The Secretary will be the keeper of time and advise speaker when time has expired. Each member of the public will be permitted to speak only once per meeting.
